### ONTARIO EDUCATIONAL SYSTEM FAILING STUDENTS WITH INTELLECTUAL **DISABILITIES: REPORT**

Students face "daunting" academic and social barriers that can leave them excluded, vulnerable to bullying and set them up for low expectations for the future, said the report, a joint project by experts in disabilities law and education.

### **Paramedical Coverage**

During the first benefit year (March 1 to August 31, 2018) the Paramedical maximums are pro-rated because of the shortened year. Starting September 1, 2018, maximums will reflect the true annual maximums covered by the plan. See chart below:

Physiotherapist Occupational Therapist Athletic Therapist	\$750	\$1,500/benefit year combined
Podiatrist/Chiropodist	\$250	\$500/benefit year combined
Psychologist Registered Marriage and Family Therapist Registered Social Worker	\$375	\$750/benefit year combined
Speech-Language Pathologist Audiologist	\$250	\$500/benefit year combined

Note: Paramedical maximums are subject to Reasonable and Customary (R&C) per visit limits set by Great West Life. We recommend when visiting a new service provider that you contact Great West Life to confirm (R&C) limits.

### **Drug Coverage dispensing fee**

The plan will cover a maximum \$11 dispensing fee
